



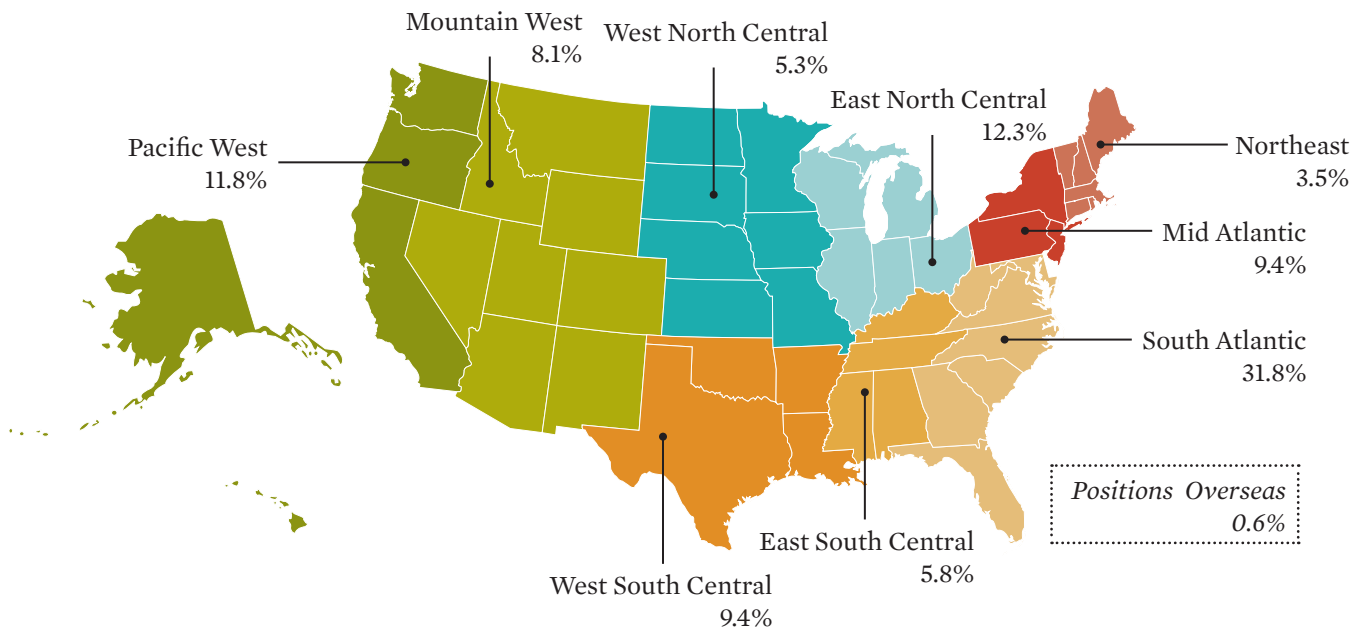

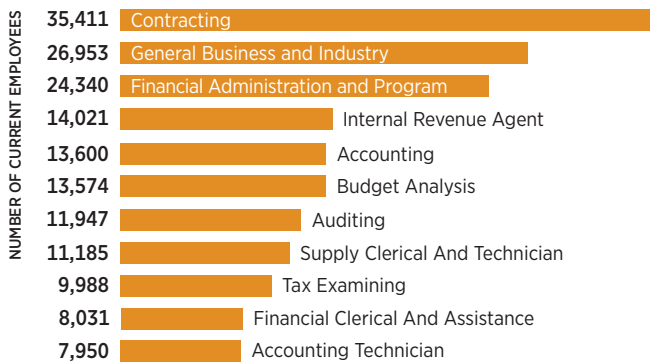

The federal government offers a variety of opportunities for individuals with knowledge and skills in contracting, finance, accounting, budget analysis and more. For example, contracting specialists ensure that troops are well-equipped at the Department of Defense, financial examiners enforce laws against abusive banking practices at the Consumer Finance Protection Bureau, and accountants, auditors, and budget analysts across the government closely monitor taxpayer dollars to reduce waste.

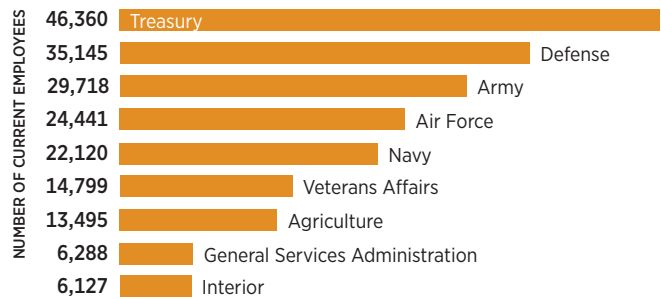
Percentage of Business and Finance Positions by Region

Job Title: Budget Analyst (0560)

Department: Department of the Army
Agency: Army Installation Management Command
Salary Range: \$47,448–\$61,678/year
Location: San Antonio, Texas

As a Budget Analyst, you will:

- Analyze and reconcile records/reports and initiate adjustment actions
- Prepare reports pertaining to financial condition, obligation, costs, undelivered orders and reimbursement
- Review actual obligation vs. programmed obligations to see if corrective/reprogramming is required

Job Title: Credit Union Examiner (0580)

Agency: National Credit Union Administration
Salary Range: \$61,695–\$85,775/year
Location: Los Angeles, California

As a Credit Union Examiner, you will:

- Plan, conduct, and complete examinations of federally chartered and federally insured credit unions
- Obtain and protect confidential credit union data
- Analyze credit union data prior to examination to identify areas of examination concentration and the persistency of previous problems
