CLASSROOM LEARNING

3 credits

One credit Internship Course (Inter-LS 260) gives students completing internships credit for reflection and professional development.

Over 200,000 living alumni in the College of Letters & Science.


Alumni Relations Coordinator builds our alumni network to:

EXPERIENTIAL EDUCATION

Experiential learning offered for each Community.

Students get a hands-on understanding of what it takes to prepare for and succeed in specific fields:

- **Treks** to visit employers and alumni for learning and networking at major hubs of employment, including New York City, Milwaukee, Chicago and Madison
- **Simulations & case studies**
- **Employer Mock Interviews**



ACADEMIC DEPARTMENTS

Engagement builds support in a decentralized college of 34 academic departments:

- Regular meetings to share resources, programming & data on student engagement
- On-demand workshops and trainings
- Major at Work events - connecting students and alumni from specific majors for networking

Academic departments now required to report career preparation efforts annually to the Dean.

Inter-LS 210: One-credit, elective career course included on nearly all majors' four-year plans.

Over 90% of departments have added new career resources for their students with our help.

L&S Career Initiative: Launched in 2014 to transform the way we prepare liberal arts & sciences students to prepare for their futures.

Decentralized career services model: 11 schools and colleges offer career services at UW-Madison.
